5. Why do we sometimes pursue worldly wisdom rather than Godly wisdom?
6. How do you summarize what Godly wisdom looks like in a person’s life?
7. James uses the words “peaceable” and “peace” in vv. 17-18. Why is this significant? Why do these words describe an important characteristic of Godly wisdom?
8. What is the connection between our personal relationships and Godly wisdom?
9. What kinds of questions has this passage of Scripture caused you to ask about yourself?
10. What needs to happen in our lives to be more obedient to Jesus as a result of these verses?
